A will is one of the most important documents you will write. Providing for your family and loved ones is your priority, it ensures they are taken care of after you are gone. Once you're happy you've made that provision, you have the opportunity to create another gift to help end homelessness for someone here in NI

You don't have to be wealthy to leave a meaningful gift. Any gift, big or small, will make a real difference to the work and future of Simon Community.

Your gift will help support our vital work, including:

Emergency Accommodation

Providing 369 warm, safe beds for those in need of emergency accommodation, across 22 sites in NI, including a dedicated family support centre. Our 250 frontline staff support approximately 3,000 people annually, proving a safe and welcoming environment while facilitating additional support needs as required.

Specialised Young People Support

35% of the people we support annually are under the age of 25 years old. Our tailored support includes:

3 bespoke Young People's
 Accommodation projects

in Belfast and Coleraine supporting 16-21 year olds.

- A Flexible Outreach Service for 16-18 years old, helping those who are most vulnerable.
- A dedicated Participation Worker delivering individual & group work.

24-hour Emergency Helpline

Last year our helpline received almost 27,000 calls from people who were homeless, or worried about losing their home. Our trained staff are on hand to offer immediate advice and signposting to our most appropriate support services.

Health & Wellbeing Support Services

Over 85% of those we help have complex needs, which can include poor mental health or addictions. To help we provide:

- Dual Diagnosis Practitioners who specialise in addiction and mental health problems.
- A dedicated Drug & Alcohol Support Worker at each of our accommodation projects.

How to leave a gift to help Simon Community NI.

Although it's not essential to consult a solicitor to make your will, we recommend you do to make sure your final wishes are carried out properly and they can assist with any queries you may have. You can find a qualified solicitor in your area via the Law Society NI, visit www.

If you would like to leave a gift to help the work of Simon Community, there are three main ways to do this:

A share of your estate. This can be a percentage of your estate once your loved ones are provided for, or it can be a specific percentage of your entire estate. As this gift is a proportion of your estate it keeps pace with inflation.

Fixed sum of money. You can choose a fixed sum of money, also known as a pecuniary gift. You can choose any amount you like.

Gift a specific item. You may also choose to leave a particular item. Some people opt to leave an antique, a piece of jewellery or even their property to charity.

The details you'll need.

To leave a gift, you'll need to make sure your will states our full name, address and charity number.
